Village Council awarded the contract for the 5th Street Water/Sewer Line Extension to Rire Pitrun & Gravel and work will start the first week of August. Residents that travel along 5th Street south of 1st Avenue will be detoured during construction, please be patient during this time.

Water Supply:

There is no worries about the Village water supply and council wants to remind residents that your monthly consumption rate was increased from 22.7 cubic meters to 35 cubic meters per month to assist residents to keep your gardens, trees, lawns etc. well-watered.

Council passed a resolution, appointing Kim Owen as Returning Officer for the Village of Warner and she will be conducting the municipal election this fall.

COUNCILLORS CORNER

With the summer months half gone, our infrastructure improvements continue, with the water and sewer extension down 5th Street from 1st Ave down to Park Avenue. This project will begin in August and should be completed as well. The water looping project on 6th Street between 5th and 7th Avenue has been completed, this will help allow for some new residential lots to be developed in the future on 7th Avenue.

The view down the west end of 3rd Avenue has drastically changed with the demolition of the two storey portion of the School, this is part of the School Modernization, and unfortunately we won't see that portion rebuilt. The rest of the School is progressing on pace with the contractors expectations, it will be nice to see it completed soon.
