VILLAGE FRIENDLY REMINDERS

Tax Sale:

Deputy Mayor LeCain moved to set the tax sale date for May 20th, 2015. The Village will be providing further information on the properties available after the March 18th, 2015 council meeting.

Tax Arrears:

Mayor Lindsay moved that the Village of Warner send a FINAL NOTICE of Tax Arrears to all residents that are 2 or more years in arrears. If the tax arrears are not paid by March 31st, 2015 the Village of Warner will start the Tax Arrears recovery process as described in the Municipal Government Act of Alberta. Notices were mailed out the first week of February to those residents that are 2 or more years in arrears.

BYLAW 562-14: Animal Control Bylaw

Bylaw 562-14 has received first reading from Village council on December 17th, 2014. The main purpose of this bylaw is for regulating and controlling dogs. A public meeting will be scheduled for March 18th, 2015 to provide the public an opportunity to have input into this bylaw before council proceeds with second and third reading. Copies of the new bylaw can be picked up at the Village office during regular business hours. Once this bylaw receives 3rd and final reading the current Animal Control Bylaw (513-09) will be repealed and Bylaw 562-14 will be the Village of Warner's Animal Control Bylaw. If you have any concerns please make your voice heard.

Village Council will be hosting an open house-public meeting on April 21st, 2015 at 7:00 pm, at the Warner Seniors Center to discuss the infrastructure upgrades scheduled for 2015, 2015 budget, 2015 tax assessment and some of the new bylaws either passed or being considered for approval. COUNCILLOR CORNER

This time around I thought it might be of interest to you to know where I go every month, on your behalf, and to hear about the activities, plans and accomplishments of the Committees that I'm on.

The first Tuesday of every month is the **Quad Municipality Physician Recruitment and Retention Committee (QMPPRC)** meeting. This group has been in existence for about five years and finally their hard work, perseverance and enthusiasm has paid off. It's easiest to quote... **From the Prairie Post of January 2015: "The two new doctors are Dr. Petrus Krog and Dr. Adaku Ifebuzor.**

According to a news release, **Dr. Krog completed his medical studies in 2009 at the University of Pretoria. He has worked with the Red Cross, did air transport of sick surgical and medical patients across South Africa and done emergency medicine shifts. Dr. Ifebuzor received her Bachelor of Medicine/Bachelor of Surgery from the University of Benin in Nigeria.**

She relocated to South Africa to complete her Master of Medicine at the University of Limpopo." It will be weeks or even months yet before they are both actually working in Milk River – but this is "for sure" and is a huge accomplishment for the whole area. By the way, the QMPPRC will be holding their Annual General Meeting, March 3, 7 pm at the Town Hall in Milk River...if you can spare a little time, they'd love to find a few new members.

The second Wednesday of every month is the **Chief Mountain Regional Solid Waste Authority (CMRSA)**. The very first meeting I found out that the Authority had contracted with 'Conroy/Ross Partners' for a 'Best Practices Study'. This has been ongoing now for about a year and will soon be wrapping up. Since there are no final decisions, at this point I can only say that there will be some changes. Some of these may only be in the way the Authority manages the business, but there may

be others that will directly affect what will be accepted at the Transfer Stations. Stay tuned – I'll do my best to keep you informed. If you have any questions, please feel free to call me at my home number below.

The third Wednesday of every month is, of course, our Regular Council meeting... "EVERYONE" is always welcome, so please join us... the more residents we see, the happier we are, and there's always free coffee to keep you awake if the meeting isn't exciting enough.

Finally, the fourth Wednesday of every month is The Heritage Handi-Bus Association. Though the Bus is based in Milk River, the service is also offered to Coutts, Warner and the County. With support from the Milk River Businessmen's Assoc. and the Kinnetes, a free Tuesday service has been offered for some months now... call 403-647-3639 and you can be picked up at your home and taken to Milk River for Dental, the Hospital, shopping or anywhere else you might want to go – maybe just meet up with friends for lunch – and then be taken home again. The regularly scheduled trips to Lethbridge go the first Thursday of every month, and then the following Fridays. The cost is only \$25, return. Again, this is a very enthusiastic group – we are currently awaiting a decision regarding our application for a grant to replace our aging bus; another member is working on a Casino application... and this brings me to ask 'you' – if you could spare a little time? We could really use some new members.

a time to be called and we'll do the rest!

Our callers do have an expectation that when you are going to be away from your home that you let the person doing the calling know that you will be away. Our volunteers must follow a protocol if we are unable to find you at the expected time. Please let us know if you will be away! This is very important.

What you can expect from us:

A cheerful voice calling you each and every day of the year, holidays included

Knowing that everything spoken in conversation remains confidential

A protocol is in place for action from your caller should you become ill or injured and be unable to answer your phone.

We are five volunteers who call on a weekly rotational basis. This service is free of charge and we call daily to ensure you are safe and well.
