VILLAGE FRIENDLY REMINDERS

◆ **Tax Sale:**

The reserve bid along with all term and conditions have been set by council at the March 18th, 2015 meeting. Each parcel will be offered for sale subject to a reserve bid and to the reservations and conditions contained in the existing certificate of title. Sale date is May 27th, 2015 at 1:30 pm.

◆ **Community Garage Sale:**

The Community Garage Sale will be on Saturday May 9th, 2015 with the hours being set by those residences that are participating. If participants could please put up some sort of sign to help identify your place as participating in this community event that would be great.

◆ **Community Clean Up:**

The week of May 11th-15th will be set aside for PW to do the community cleanup. Please if you can sort your piles of stuff to be removed into all wood, all metal and all garbage so the crews can easily remove them and dispose of them in the appropriate place. Fridges do cost \$10.00 each to be disposed of and you have to make arrangements prior to your appliance being picked up at the Village office. The charge is used so that the Freon can be removed properly by trained technician.

◆ **Burning:**

Another reminder that residents of the Village of Warner are only allowed to burn on Friday's and Saturday's during calm weather, the Village continues to get complaints of burning on other days and during windy conditions. If the complaints continue council may be forced to develop a burning bylaw complete with fines for any violations.

◆ **Street Sweepers:**

There will be street sweepers in the Village of Warner approximately May 3rd, 2015 weather permitting. Please have all vehicles & trailers off all paved roads the first week of May so the streets can be swept and cleaned.

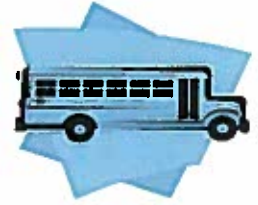
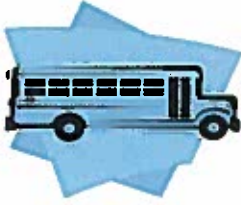

Without the tireless efforts of palaeontologists like Francois, Devil's Coulee Dinosaur and Heritage Museum would not be what it is today. Thank you for your continued support Francois, and we look forward to seeing you again later this year!

Pursuit of Dinosaur Eggs!

In August 2014, palaeontological technicians Dawna Macleod and Marilyn Laframboise (right) assisted Dr. Francois Therrien, a world-renowned curator of palaeoecology from the Royal Tyrell Museum, in excavating what could possibly be a dinosaur nest from the Devil's Coulee site. Trish Hill, the General Manager for Devil's Coulee, had this to say: "I've been here for eight years and this is absolutely fantastic. It's thrilling to know there's a possible nest just a hop, skip and a jump away from where we've been giving tours." Devil's Coulee is expecting visits from Francois later this year for further excavations and prospecting.



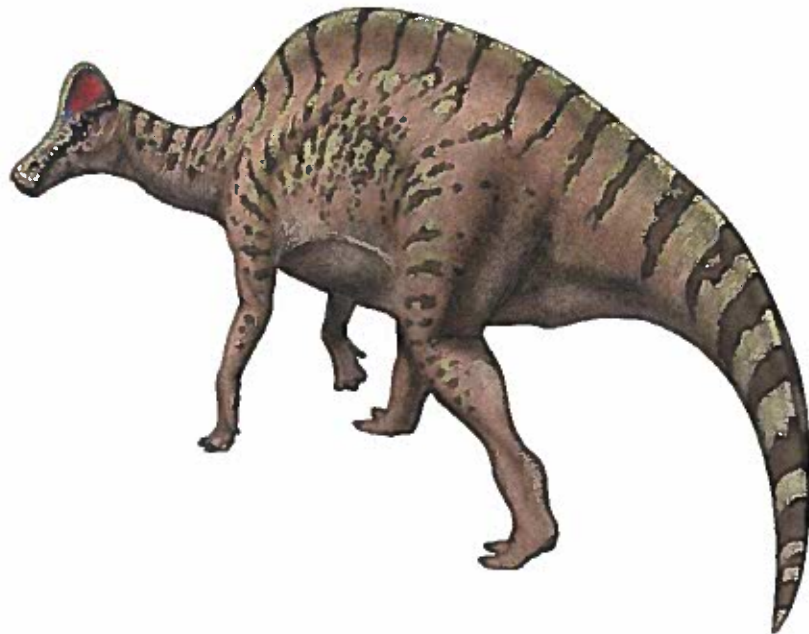
