Village Council News December 2020: Council Business:

Council passed first reading of Borrowing Bylaw 565-21 after reviewing sections 251-256 of the MGA. Section 251(3) states that we must after first reading advertise the bylaw to the residents of the Village before proceeding to 2nd & 3rd readings. A copy of the bylaw is in the newsletter for all residents to review, please note that the Village has not used this line of credit for the past 4 years.

Council also passed the 2021 Interim Budget which is based on the 2020 budget and it will be in place until Council passes the 2021 Operating Budget in May 2021. Council is once again preparing the 2021 operating and capital budgets which of course will have an impact on residential taxes. Council would like to hear from the residents before passing the budgets and 2021 tax bylaw, so please make your voice known.

Section 284.2(1) of the MGA requires the Village of Warner to appoint a qualified assessor to carry out the duties, powers and functions of the municipal assessor under the Act, council has approved Benchmark Assessment Consultants as the Village assessor for the 2021 year.

Section 280(1) states "each council MUST appoint one or more auditors for the municipality". Council has approved Mercer Wilde Group as the Village of Warner's Auditor for the 2020 audit.

Next Council Meeting is January 20th, 2021 @ 5:30 pm Village office, please follow all COVID 19 restrictions put out by the Province when accessing the office in person please, masks are mandatory.

Council & staff are once again observing many developments taking place without a development permit being approved first, we have informed the Community Peace Officers to start enforcing the Land Use Bylaw in the New Year.

MUNICIPAL BORROWING BYLAW

For the purpose Specified in Section 256 of the Municipal Government Act Bylaw No. 565-21.

WHEREAS the Council of the Municipality of the Village of Warner (hereinafter called the "Corporation") in the Province of Alberta, considers it necessary to borrow certain sums of money for the purpose of:

Financing Operating Expenditures

NOW THEREFORE pursuant to the provisions of the Municipal Government Act, it is hereby enacted by the Council of the Corporation as a Bylaw that:

- The Corporation borrow from Alberta Treasury Branches ("ATB") up on the principal sum of \$112,000.00 repayable upon demand at a rate of interest per annum not to exceed the Prime Lending Rate from time to time established by ATB, and such interest will be calculated daily and due and payable monthly on the last day of each and every month.
- 2. The Chief Elected Officer and the Chief Administrative Officer are authorized for and on behalf of the Corporation:
 - to apply to ATB for the aforesaid loan to the Corporation and to arrange with ATB the amount, terms and conditions of the loan and security of securities to be given to ATB;
 - b) as security for any money borrowed from ATB
 - to execute promissory notes and other negotiable instruments or evidences of debt for such loans and renewals of all such promissory notes and other negotiable instruments or evidences of debts;
 - to given or furnish to ATB all such securities and promises as ATB may require to secure repayment of such loans and interest thereon; and
 - to execute all security agreements, hypothecations, debentures, charges, pledges, conveyances, assignments and transfers to and in favour of ATB of all or any property, real or personal, moveable or immovable, now or hereafter owned by the Corporation or in which the Corporation may have any interest, and any other documents or contracts necessary to give or to furnish to ATB the security or securities required by it.
- 3. The source or sources of money to be used to repay the principal and interest owing under the borrowing from ATB are from the operating budget.

- 4. The amount to be borrowed and the term of the loan will not exceed any restrictions set forth in the Municipal Government Act.
- In the event that the Municipal Government Act permits extension of the term of the loan and in the event the Council of the Corporation decides to extend the loan and ATB is prepared to extend the loan, any renewal or extension, bill, debenture, promissory note, or other obligation executed by the officers designed in paragraph 3 hereof and delivered to ATB will be valid and conclusive proof as against the Corporation of the decision of the Council to extend the loan in accordance with the terms of such renewal or extension, bill, debenture, promissory note, or other obligation, and ATB will not be bound to inquire into the authority of such officers to execute and deliver any such renewal, extension document or security.
- 6. This Bylaw comes into force on the final passing thereof.

WE HEREBY CERTIFY that the foregoing resolution was duly passed by the Council of the Corporation therein mentioned at a duly and regularly constituted meeting thereof held on the 20th day of January, 2021 at which a quorum was present, as entered in the minutes of the said Council, and that the Bylaw has come into force and is still in full force and effect.

Dear Mayor Lindsay and Council,

I am writing with respect to the petition submitted by electors of the Village of Warner requesting a viability review. The petition has been reviewed and deemed sufficient in accordance with the *Municipal Government Act (MGA)*.

At the time the petition was received, the population of the town was 373. Section 130(2)(b) of the *MGA* states a petition requesting a viability review must be signed by electors of the municipality, numbering at least 30 per cent of the municipality's population. Electors must be excluded if they do not meet specific criteria. Based on the population of the town, 112 signatures were required for the viability review petition to be sufficient.

The petition received contained 161 signatures. Ten signatures were excluded, as they did not meet the mandatory petition requirements set out in the MGA. This resulted in 151 signatures remaining on the petition.

After careful consideration, I have decided a viability review of the village would be an appropriate course of action at this time. I have also decided that a vote of electors on the question of dissolution will be part of this viability review, and will be conducted after a viability review report is distributed to residents and property owners.

My ministry will work closely with the administrations of the Village of Warner and the County of Warner to collect information and develop the viability review report. The village, county, and the provincial municipal associations will have a further opportunity to review the draft viability review report and provide comments before it is finalized, distributed to village residents and property owners, and made available to the general public.

The ministry will be in contact with your administration to plan the next steps of the viability review, including a letter from my ministry to Village of Warner residents and property owners to confirm the initiation of this review.






